It also had a PDC-S Auto Tracking Spectrophotometer. I found the Komori PDC system to be especially useful for color control and to keep consistent registration fit. The Komori was a UV press.

The Heidelberg SM 102 8/color was a CD press used for direct mail printing and board stock. It had an x-rite Intelli Trax 2 densitometer which I found especially useful to monitor and maintain my color. I also used a hand-held densitometer to take L*a*b* readings at specified x-y positions.

I've gotta tell ya, there are some features on both presses I like and I can't make up my mind on which I like better, the Komori or the Heidelberg. I am looking forward to running the newer Heidelberg like the XL.
